During the period from 10 to 13 July, six problems were selected for the 40th IMO competition from 27 shortlisted problems, through a voting process by team leaders. On 13 July, the official English version of the problems was approved by the Jury comprising all the team leaders. It was then translated into 50 languages. The procedure for setting up the competition problems was completed by 14 July.

The opening ceremony of the 40th IMO was held at the Royal Palace Hall on 15 July. The two days of competition were held at the Politehnica University on 16 and 17 July. Each paper is a four and a half hours test consisting of 3 problems. The answer scripts were marked by the leader and the deputy leader. Coordination of the marking was done in the next two days on 18 and 19 July. On 19 July, the Jury held its final meeting to decide the cut-off scores for medals. They were decided as follows:

> Gold 28 - 42 points Silver 19 - 27 points Bronze 12 - 18 points

The closing ceremony was held at the Parliament Palace on 21 July. A total of 38 gold, 70 silver and 118 bronze medals were awarded at the closing ceremony.
